The Wisconsin State Women In The Outdoors chapter hosted another successful 3-day event. Over 115 women attended the ninth annual Women In The Outdoors event, held August 25th-27th at Camp Minikani near Hubertus, Wisconsin.

There were a lot of familiar faces and old friends in the crowd, and many brought along someone new this year! All combinations of friends and family were represented-mother-daughters, sisters, aunts and nieces, co-workers, and neighbors. This event offered them a chance to learn new skills, or polish up on old ones, while receiving cheers and encouragement along the way.

Participants began arriving at camp Friday afternoon, where they picked up their registration packets and headed off to their cabins to relax and get acquainted with the campground and cabin mates. After an evening dinner and a few announcements, everyone was entertained by a fashion show that consisted of the participants breaking up into teams. They each received the same bag of materials and each team had to create an outdoor outfit from the materials in the bag. Each team then selected a model and a spokesperson from their team and they each walked to the music, with the spokesperson describing the outfit and giving a short bio on the model. The rest of the evening was spent at the campfire, or trying out some 3-D laser shooting on the unit operated by the DNR.

Saturday morning brought everyone together for a hearty breakfast, followed by two 3-hour sessions of courses, morning and afternoon. A fortifying lunch was served in between. Courses offered this year included canoeing, dream catcher creating, deer hunting & tracking, fly tying, GPS naviagation, horseback riding, low ropes, women's

awareness training, river fishing. taxidermy/pheasant wreath creating. trapshooting, waterfowl hunting, wilderness first aid, archery, fly fishing. muzzleloading, outdoor cooking, stick to staff, hiking, wood carving, backpacking, basic chainsaw operation, frisbee golf, high ropes, kayaking. turkey hunting, bow hunter's challenge. handgun shooting, making a wingbone call and a Lewis Shoot. Many participants took advantage of the marksmanship trap shooting. pistol/handgun classes offered down the road at the Daniel Boone Conservation Club. Ladies were excited to show off the dream ctachers, pheasant wreaths. wingbones, flies that they tied and the ornaments they carved and told stories of the clay pigeons they broke and the fish that were released.

Before dinner, the ladies had some free time which was used to learn how to back up a trailer, camo face painting, fish printing or doing a photo album craft. Ladies took advantage of the pool and cooled off with a quick swim. The Outdoor Cooking class had lots of leftovers which served as the best kind of camp hors d'oeuvres!

The day's events concluded with handing out the bountiful supply of prizes to the raffle winners and the successful bidders on the Live and Silent Aution. The Auctioneer tapped the competitive spirit spirit of the crowd and helped raise over \$1800 on the live auction.

Plans for next year's event are already underway and it will be held August 24-26 at Camp Minikani.
